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| Course Description: | To introduce basic Latin grammar and vocabulary. To help students understand the ancient Roman culture and its influences on America. To gain an appreciation of William Shakespeare's plays. To help students recognize Latin words as English derivatives. |
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| Methods of Evaluation: | Graded workbook lessons Weekly vocabulary tests Weekly observations during class participation |
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| Pace of Instruction: | One 30-minute lesson per week |
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| Course Objectives: | At the end of this course students should be able to: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Be familiar with approximately 700 Greco-Roman roots of the English language. 2. Create English words from Latin derivatives. 3. Identify the Latin alphabet. 4. Identify basic Roman Numerals. 5. Identify Latin number words one through ten. 6. Understand the use of verbs, proper nouns, prepositions, pronouns, adjectives, adverbs, and common nouns in Latin and English. 7. Be familiar with conjugating verbs and declining nouns in English and Latin. 8. Differentiate between present and future tense in Latin and English. 9. Say the Lord's Prayer, Sanctus, Table Blessing, and Doxology in Latin and English with the class. 10. Identify the Latin names of many constellations. 11. Understand the origin of the Julian calendar and days of the week and the Latin meanings behind the months of the year. 12. Be familiar with Greco-Roman mythology and compare it to the truth of Scripture. 13. Identify Latin and Roman Numerals on American currency. 14. Appreciate the secular and biblical history of the Ancient Roman Empire beginning with Nebuchadnezzar's dream in the book of Daniel in the Bible. 15. Sing 1000 year old ecclesiastical songs in Latin. 16. Understand the significance of a sundial and its use in the scriptures and the Ancient Roman Empire. |
